

Artist of the month

SUSAN ROMYN

Little one inch houses and owls. Sparkling silver jewellery. Tactile grey and white clay sculptures adorned with her trademark "happy bird". Paintings featuring cute puppies and fish. These fruits of Susan Romyn's work are well known to anyone who has browsed the Art Space gift shop, or seen the last two small sculpture exhibitions.

From childhood, Susan knew she was a visual person. Encouraged by her dad, she would draw constantly.

Susan immersed herself in Art subjects at school and likewise at university in Melbourne where her main areas of focus were Japanese joinery and printmaking. After training, Susan taught for fifteen years before taking the leap to being a full time artist.

The "happy bird" features in many of Susan's sculptural, painted and jewellery pieces, and reflects her philosophy of aiming to be happy and share that happiness with others. This imagery that threads through the different media can be seen as her visual language, an expression of how she navigates the world.

Her work reflects a life where she tries to capture the stillness of the small, but really important moments, either real or imagined, that give her joy.

We are thrilled to have Susan as a member of the Art Space.
